this book offers a broad based contemporary perspective on bible translation in terms of academic areas foundational to the endeavor translation studies communication theory linguistics cultural studies biblical studies and literary and rhetorical studies the discussion of each area is geared towards non specialists to introduce them to notions trends and tools that can contribute to their understanding of translation the bible translator is encouraged to appreciate various approaches to translation in view of the wide variety of communicative organizational and sociocultural situations in which translation occurs however literary representation of the scriptures receives special attention since it has been neglected in earlier influential works on bible translation in addition to useful introductory and concluding sections the book consists of six chapters scripture translation in the era of translation studies translation and communication the role of culture in communication advances in linguistic theory and their relavance to translation biblical studies and bible translation and a Iterary approach to biblical text analysis and translation the authors are translation consultants for the united bible societies they have worked with translation projects in various media and in languages ranging from ones of a few hundred speakers to international ones in africa the americas and asia

young s literal translation of the bible is as the name implies a strictly literal translation of the hebrew and greek texts from the textus receptus and majority text compiled by robert young in 1862 he went on to produce a revised version in 1887 based on the westcott hort text which had been completed in 1885 young died on october 14 1888 and the publisher released a new revised edition in 1898 young used the present tense in many places where other translations used the past tense particularly in narratives the preface to the second edition states if a translation gives a present tense when the original gives a past or a past when it has a present a perfect for a future or a future for a perfect an a for a the or a the for an a an imperative for a subjunctive or a subjunctive for an imperative a verb for a noun or a noun for a verb it is clear that verbal inspiration is as much overlooked as if it had no existence the word of god is made void by the traditions of men emphasis in original for example the ylt version of genesis begins as follows 1 in the beginning of god s preparing the heavens and the earth 2 the earth hath existed waste and void and darkness on the face of the deep and the spirit of god fluttering on the face of the waters 3 a god saith let light be and light is 4 and god seeth the light that it is g seperateth between the light and the darkness 5 and god alled to the light day and to the darkness he hath called night and there is an evening and there is a morning day one young s literal translation in the 1898 edition also consistently renders the hebrew tetragrammaton the four hebrew letters usually transliterated yhwh or jhvh that form a biblical proper name of god throughout the old covenant testament as jehovah instead of the traditional practice of lord in small capitals which was used in editions prior to 1898

young s usage of english present tense rather than past tense has been supported by scholars ranging from the medieval jewish rabbi rashi who advised if you are going to interpret this passage in its plain sense interpret it thus at the beginning of the creation of heaven and earth when the earth was or the earth being unformed and void god said let there be light to richard elliott friedman in his translation of the five books in the bible with sources revealed 2002 there is a linked table of contents for each book and chapter

bible translators have focused their efforts on preparing a text that is clear natural and accurate with the expectation that audiences will understand the message if it is in their language field research among the adioukrou of c□te d ivoire shows that aud need to have access to the contextual information the author expected his audience to bring to the text when such information is provided both understanding of and interest in the message increase dramatically these findings support relevance theory s claim that meaning is inferred from the interaction of text and context to the extent that the contextual knowledge evoked by the text for contemporary audiences differs from that evoked for the first audience understanding is impaired the bible at cultural crossroads presents a model to assist translators in identifying contextual mismatches and applies it on the thematic level to mismatches between first century jewish and adioukrou views of the unseen world and on the passage level to contextual mismatches arising from four gospel passages in text and out of text solutions for adjusting contextual mismatches are explored with field research results showing the effectiveness of various solutions context is shown to be both a significant factor in communication and a dynamic one translations of the text alone are not sufficient for successful communication

martin pauw was born in 1940 at madzimoyo mission eastern zambia where both his grandparents and parents had served as missionaries after completing his theological studies at the university of stellenbosch he was ordained in malawi in the church of central africa presbyterian ccap in 1965 like his great grandfather grandfather and father he became a missionary the fourth generation he served as youth pastor and lecturer at the ccap theological college at nkhoma until 1973 from 1975 he lectured at justo mwale theological

college of the reformed church in zambia in lusaka and from 1983 to 2001 he was lecturer and eventually professor in missiology in the faculty of theology at the university of stellenbosch where he also had previously completed his doctoral studies with a thesis on the history of the ccap nkhoma synod over the years prof pauw acted as study leader to a large number of under and post graduate students authored a considerable number of publications and served in various leadership positions in the church after retiring as lecturer he served the western cape synod of the dutch reformed church for a further six years as secretary for witness and focussed on building partnerships between the drc and sister churches in various countries in africa his vast experience in knowledge of and passion for humbly serving the churches in southern and central africa is remarkable

how should we help equip the church leaders of africa today there remains a well documented lack of theologically sound bible centric preaching in sub saharan africa the majority of sermons are preached by untrained or undertrained church leaders following a practical theology praxis this book develops a conceptual framework for the evaluation of existing alternative approaches to grassroots preacher training it also proposes broad principles for effective preacher training and offers a practical solution the 20th century had seen the christian church in africa grow 36 fold to 360 million this amazing growth is arguably the largest religious change in human history in such a short period it has shifted the focus of christianity from north to south this rapid growth is debatably considered by some missiologists and theologians to have resulted in an african church a mile wide and an inch deep that is a church of great size but lacking in spiritual depth the rapid growth has led to insufficient numbers of trained leaders being available to oversee their congregations most leaders are unpaid untrained or undertrained leaders have an inadequate knowledge of scripture and lack understanding of its interpretation they also lack the skills they need to communicate its truths even so they preach up to 90 of the sermons in rural africa despite a tremendous hunger for training among many of those preachers traditional college based theological education cannot keep up with the demand for trained pastors and preachers in an affordable or culturally appropriate manner
