all over the world even as you read this mothers in poor countries struggle to deliver their babies without lifesaving medical care this is perhaps the last unreached frontier of modern medicine walk with dr jean chamberlain froese as she extends a hand of compassion and professional care to mothers in desperate danger in these days of high tech medicine it is refreshing that a doctor writes first hand so passionately about people and their real lives these moving stories should serve as a call for action by all who care professor mahmoud f fathalla past president of the international federation of gynaecology and obstetrics reading dr chamberlain froese s vignettes i was moved to tears and anger and prayer for the women who live in such poverty of health care she has captured the pathos hope and despair of women who have so little of what we see as essential health care during pregnancy and delivery i believe this book has a vital message that will open new dimensions in understanding and compassion becky davey rn bs mn international consultant for medical and educational advance the medicalization of health care in the west has lead to a laissez faire attitude towards childbirth blending experience with passion dr chamberlain froese confronts and dispels conventional thinking by unveiling the tragic realities of pregnancy related complications reading this book makes you uncomfortable and it should it unfolds the plight of those who daily live on the fulcrum of life or death dr john d hull president equip international atlanta georgia dr jean chamberlain froese is a canadian obstetrician gynaecologist whose work has taken her to some of the many neglected mothers in the developing world in zambia zimbabwe pakistan ecuador and most recently yemen and uganda when in canada she is based in hamilton ontario where she is an assistant professor at mcmaster university and executive director of save the mothers she is happily married to thomas froese a freelance journalist they have two children elizabeth and jonathan

a mother s advice to her daughter a guide to daily living both practical and sublime with full color illustrations throughout one sleepless night while she was in her early twenties illustrator writer hallie bateman had a painful

realization her mom would die and after she died she would be gone the prospect was devastating and also scary how would she navigate the world without the person who gave her life she thought about all the motherly advice she would miss advice that could help her through the challenges to come including the ordeal of losing a parent the next day hallie asked her mother writer suzy hopkins to record step by step instructions for her to follow in the event of her mom s death the list began pour yourself a stiff glass of whiskey and make some fajitas and continued from there walking hallie through the days months and years of life after loss with motherly guidance and support addressing issues great and small from choosing a life partner to baking a quiche the project became a way for mother and daughter to connect with humor openness and gratitude it led to this book combining suzy s wit and heartfelt advice with hallie s quirky and colorful style what to do when i m gone is the illustrated instruction manual for getting through life without one s mom it s also a poignant look at loss love and taking things one moment at a time by turns whimsical funny touching and above all pragmatic it will leave readers laughing and teary eyed and it will spur conversations that enrich family members understanding of one another

using photographs from the time historical documents and works of art cumming investigates this case of stolen identity w ith the toolset of a detective and the unique intimacy of a daughter trying to understand her family s past and its legacies brilliant the guardian and a story told with such depth of feeling and observation and such lyrical writing i couldn t put it down anna quindlen on chapel sands is a masterful blend of memoir and history an extraordinary personal narrative unlike any other

i m not telling you where i am don t try to find me remember go ask alice augusta gone is the memoir alice s mother never wrote a single parent martha tod dudman is sure she is giving her two children the perfect life sheltering them from the wild tumult of her own youth but when augusta turns fifteen things start to happen first the cigarette then the blue pipe and the little bag augusta says is aspirin just talking to her is like sticking your hand in the garbage disposal martha doesn t know if she s confronting adolescent behavior craziness her own failures as a parent or all three augusta gone is the story of a girl who is doing everything to hurt herself and a mother who would try anything to save her it is a sorrowful tale but not a tragic one though the book charts a harrowing course through the troubled waters of adolescence hope that mother and daughter will be reunited and will learn to love one another again steers them toward a shore of forgiveness and redemption written with darkly seductive grace augusta gone conjures the dangerous thrill of being drawn into the heart of a whirling vortex this daring book will be admired for its lyricism applauded for its courage and remembered for its power it demands to be read from start to finish in one breathless sitting

haunting unflinching and at times unexpectedly hilarious a powerful affirmation of family bonds the new york times book review a daughter s longing love letter to a mother who has slipped beyond reach just past seventy alex witchel s smart adoring ultracapable mother began to exhibit undeniable signs of dementia her smart adoring ultracapable daughter reacted as she d been raised if something was broken they would fix it but as medical reality undid that hope and her mother continued the torturous process of disappearing in plain sight witchel retreated to the kitchen trying to reclaim her mother at the stove by cooking the comforting foods of her childhood is there any contract tighter than a family recipe reproducing the perfect meat loaf was no panacea but it helped witchel come to terms with her predicament the growing phenomenon of ambiguous loss loss of a beloved one who lives on gradually she developed a deeper appreciation for all the ways the parent she was losing lived on in her starting with the daily commandment tell me everything that happened today that started a future reporter and writer on her way and she was inspired to turn her experience into this frank bittersweet and surprisingly funny account that offers true balm for an increasingly familiar form of heartbreak

thirty or forty years ago everybody knew what that phrase meant a girl or a young unmarried woman had gotten herself pregnant she was in trouble she had brought indescribable shame on herself and her family in those days it was unthinkable that she would have her child and keep it instead she had to hide most likely she would be sent away to a home for unwed mothers where she would stay in secrecy until her baby was born and given up for adoption gone to an aunt s was the usual cover story a fiction that everyone understood but no on talked about until now in gone to an aunt s journalist and long time television host anne petrie takes us back into these homes for unwed mothers most cities in canada had at least one home several as many as five or six most of them run by religious organizations here in institutional settings the girls were kept out of sight until their time was up and they could return to the world as if nothing had happened seven women including the author recount their experiences in gone to an aunt s talking openly some for the first time about how they got pregnant the reaction of their parents

friends boyfriends and lovers why they wound up in a home and how they managed to cope with its rules and regulations no last names no talking about the past and the promise of salvation that could come only through work and prayer gone to an aunt s is a profoundly moving and compassionate even alarming account it comes as a reminder that we not get too wistful for the supposedly innocent times before the sexual revolution that innocence petrie shows vividly was a charade made believable only because the thousands of girls who had broken the rules were hidden away

an intergenerational collection of personal narratives by women in the 21st century who mother from the margins of our society it features 20 stories of caretakers who have both overcome their own personal challenges and are now making a difference in the public sphere today this coffee table book offers readers an opportunity to experience the lives of detestable or reprehensible moms from the perspective of the women we love to judge filled with stunning photography and provocative stories it challenges popular perceptions of teen moms survivors of domestic violence and baby mamas it adds complexity to stereotypical stories about mamas who abuse drugs or engage in sex work and it demonstrates both the humanity and value of the very mothers our society often dismisses this book is an excellent choice for scholars of motherhood studies black women s autobiographies sociology gender and women s studies and rhetoric it is a must read book for social workers every woman who has ever been called infamous should own a copy it will inspire inform and make you laugh but above all it will remind you of your power back cover

new momism a trend in american culture that is causing women to feel that only through the perfection of motherhood can true contentment be found this vision of motherhood is highly romanticized and yet its standards for success remain forever out of reach no matter how hard women may try to have it all the mommy myth takes a provocative tour through the past thirty years of media images about mothers the superficial achievements of the celebrity mom the news media s sensational coverage of dangerous day care the staging of the mommy wars between working mothers and stay at home moms and the onslaught of values based marketing that raises mothering standards to impossible levels just to name a few in concert with this messaging the authors contend is a conservative backwater of talking heads propagating the myth of the modern mom this nimble assessment of how motherhood has been shaped by out of date mores is not about whether women should have children or not or about whether once they have kids mothers should work or stay at home it is about how no matter what they do or how hard they try women will never achieve the promised nirvana of idealized mothering douglas and michaels skillfully map the distance traveled from the days when the feminine mystique demanded more for women than the unpaid labor of keeping house and raising children to today s not so subtle pressure to reverse this thirty year trend a must read for every woman

writing on the moon stories and poetry from the creative unconscious by psychoanalysts and others is a collection of the best works published over the past fifteen years in the creative literary section of psychoanalytic perspectives along with imaginative introductions by the author some writings are raw and honest some are dark and access our primal being others filled with beauty illuminate the internal life the playful mind and unconscious doodlings that might otherwise remain unformulated

what can the past teach us about what it means to be a good christian parent today today s parenting guidance can sometimes feel timeless and inviolable especially when it comes to the spiritual formation of children in christian households but even in the recent past parenting philosophies have differed widely among christians in ways that reflect the contexts from which they emerged in this illuminating historical study david setran catalogs the varying ways american protestants envisioned the task of childrearing in the seventeenth eighteenth and nineteenth centuries comparing two main historical time periods the colonial era and the victorian era setran uncovers common threads opposing viewpoints and the cultural and religious influences behind the dominant parenting postures of each era the

implications of his findings matter for today s big questions about parenting should children be viewed as basically good in need of protection from corruption or as fundamentally sinful in need of moral correction how should parents address misbehavior should a parent s primary role be that of teacher disciplinarian or nurturer what importance should be attributed to devotions and prayer church involvement sabbath keeping home decorating and fun family activities what consideration should be given to gender should boys and girls be raised differently do mothers and fathers have essentially different responsibilities as he surveys these historical perspectives setran reflects on the legacy and future of christian parenting concluding that the protestant heritage encourages the importance of intentional devotional practices the development of close parent child bonds and the creation of godly household environments in the end he argues that all of these historical values are critical to the full expression of christian parental love this is a love that teaches because it wants to help children understand true goodness that admonishes and restrains because it wants to protect children from whatever keeps them from true pleasure and joy that fosters strong relationships so children might experience the lavishness of god s love that models christlike sacrifice and guides children into the arms of their creator
